

**SEPT. 2**

Whoever said Spider-Man was unusual? Meet Spider Wasp. Stuart McCausland was surprised to watch and photograph a black and yellow mud dauber on a hunting mission as it deftly negotiated a spider web in the Diamond Springs area of Virginia Beach.

"I had my camera up and was following the mud dauber as it wove in and out among the leaves," McCausland wrote, "looking for a spider to take home for its babies."

He watched as the mud dauber headed toward a spider web strand.

When it got to the silk thread, the wasp just turned upside down and shimmied down foot over foot," McCausland wrote. "Too cool!"

Black and yellow mud dauber females paralyze spiders and store them in their mud nests as food for their young wasps.

"In retrospect I should not have been amazed that a spider-killing wasp could walk on a spider web," McCausland said. "After all it would seem a logical

evolutionary step. But I WAS amazed." And Spider Wasp is for real.

**SEPT. 5**

There's a downside to being a handsome green and red orchard spider, like this one that Tracy Franco photographed in Ocean Lakes in Virginia Beach.

Because of its reddish-orange belly marking, some folks mistake the orchard spider for the venomous black widow spider.

But a black widow spider is shiny patent-leather black with a red hourglass mark on her belly.

And as you can see, the orchard spider is shiny green.

Besides you would never be apt to see the two spiders in the same place.

The black widow spider builds a messy web in a dark corner of your shed or woodpile and tries to hunker down out of sight in daylight hours. She wants only to protect her eggs.

The orchard spider's Latin name is *Leucauge Venusta*. *Leucauge* is for "gleaming" and *venusta* for "beautiful."

And this orb weaver builds it spiraling, more or less horizontal web over bushes and low tree branches where its beauty is on full display.
