The Division of Solid Waste Management (Division) acknowledges the receipt of the above referenced report. The document contains a recommendation to perform additional sampling for lead in soils west and southwest of the Midway RV Park. This sampling is recommended to determine whether elevated lead concentrations found in this area during the RFI are representative of soil conditions. The Division approves the recommendation. The Navy may submit this information as a supplemental technical memo to the RFI.

Additional recommendations include leaving contaminated soil in place at the pistol range berm, evaluating a final remedy for the clay pigeon accumulation areas along the sides of the pistol range berm and the proposal of land use controls for the trap/skeet Ranges 1 and 2. The Division will evaluate these recommendations as part of the Corrective Measures Study. However, in the interim, the Navy may implement any land use controls that are required to protect human health and the environment until the CMS is final.
