medication and procedures for other families at the children's hospital.

"All of those pills and surgeries, they cost so much money," he said. "There were so many other children there like her in need of the same treatment and in need of the same comfort."

Rubin's father, Steve, said that his son learned about being charitable and helping others in school—but going out and actually putting those lessons into practice is an entirely different thing.

"You can talk about giving back, but to go out there and stand outside of stores and ask people to help, that takes a great amount of effort," said Steve. "He's the captain of the varsity running team and he knows what it means to strive for a goal and to endure. And he really put his heart into this."

Lichtenstein has endured a heart-wrenching heap of trials since her camp accident, according to Steve Ruben. She has had about 13 surgeries and experimental skin grafts that are only performed at the Westchester hospital. She is home now, but Lichtenstein is still going through treatments and can only attend two periods of school per day.

"Our heart goes out to her and her

family and really any child that has to go through this," said Steve. "And I think this experience has opened Michael's eyes about how life can change in an instant."

Indeed, the younger Rubin, along with his friends and the Plainview school community at large, has had his perspective shaken by Lichtenstein's experience. And he hopes his message, and his efforts to raise funds, reaches the community

in a profound and vital way.

"When you see the way something like this can impact a person's life, it changes the way you think," he said. "We hope everyone comes to this event, gives what they can and shows support for Jaide."


to 5:45 p.m. at the high school's track and field.
