Hundreds of students, their families, staff and well-wishers gathered in the Farmingdale High School gym Oct. 9 for a rally in celebration of that night's Homecoming football game against Hicksville. Crowned King & Queen, above, were Max Sturm and Becky Wenzel. On the field, meanwhile, the Dalers crushed the Comets 42-0 in the Nassau Conference I tilt for their third straight shutout. Jordan McLune again led Farmingdale on the ground, with 10 rushes for 59 yards and three touchdowns in the first half as Farmingdale took a 21-0 lead at halftime. Also scoring were Hakeem Cesar on an 89-yard kickoff return and Kevin Eversley and Anthony Burriesci, on short runs. Sophomore Briant DeFelice converted all six PATs. Quarterback Tommy Donovan completed 7-of-10 passes for 91 yards, with Cesar snaring three for 54 yards. The defense was paced by Darin Simon (six tackles) and Ryan Charleston (five tackles, fumble recovery).
