# Levittown Resident Wins Award In 'Aqua Run'

Congratulations to 26-year-old Alejandro Centeno of Levittown, who was the first place finisher in the 25-29 age group in the fourth annual UJA-Federation of New York Aqua Run held at TOBAY Beach on Sept. 20.

Centeno completed the 800-meter swim followed by a 3-mile run through the TOBAY Beach Bird and Game Preserve in 43 minutes, 18 seconds.

Summer's Not Done Aqua Run is a low key, no pressure event that everyone who participates thoroughly enjoys, perhaps because it is low key and no pressure. This year 279 athletes enjoyed a beautiful day at TOBAY Beach, with 117 completing the 800-meter swim followed by a 3-mile run, 34 teams of two completing the course, and 94 people opting for the run only.

The entire net proceeds of the Aqua Run go to benefit UJA-Federation of New York, together with its

60,000 contributors, and its efforts to transform the lives of 4.5 million people in New York, in Israel, and around the world.
