FOR THE MEMBERS OF THE TECHNICAL REVIEW COMMITTEE (TRC) FOR THE
INSTALLATION RESTORATION PROGRAM AT NAVAL WEAPONS INDUSTRIAL RESERVE
PLANT (NWIRP) CALVERTON, NEW YORK

Enclosed is a copy of the Department of Navy's final comment responses regarding the RCRA Facility Assessment (RFA) - Sampling Visit Addendum for NWIRP Calverton, New York. This document provides responses to those comments submitted to this office from various Technical Review Committee (TRC) members during the review and comment period for the Draft report.

The RFA Addendum was conducted in order to provide additional analytical data for various Installation Restoration (IR) areas throughout the NWIRP facility. These areas included Site 8 - Coal Pile Storage Area; Site 9 - ECM Area; Site 10A - Jet Fuel Systems Lab Cesspool Area; Site 10B - Engine Test House Cesspool Area; the Southern Area and; the Golf Course which is downgradient of Site 2.

Due to the impending transfer of this land to the Town of Riverhead, it is required that a Finding of Suitability to Transfer (FOST) document be prepared which establishes that certain parcels are in a suitable environmental condition so as to warrant transfer. To this end, the Navy recommended no further action (NFA) for Sites 8, 9, and the southern area. Some questions were forwarded regarding these areas and the comment response document did prepare responses to those concerns. Please review these responses carefully and be prepared to discuss any additional concerns regarding NFA recommendations at the upcoming TRC meeting on September 17, 1996. The time and place of this meeting was submitted under separate correspondence.
