Dear Dr. Stehman:

In accordance with Title 15A, Chapter 2, Subchapter 2N of the North Carolina Administrative Code, enclosures (1) through (5) are submitted for closure under the Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) Program.

Upon underground storage tank removal, analytical results from samples taken in the excavation at each of the five sites (BB-46, BB-9, BB-51, TC-942, and STC-868) revealed petroleum contamination. Therefore, investigations including soil borings and the subsequent installation of monitoring wells were performed. Under these investigations, soil and groundwater samples analyzed revealed petroleum contamination levels that were below regulatory limits. However, solvents and metals were found in both soil and groundwater samples at all sites. Since these investigations indicate Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act regulated contaminants, Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune is requesting that further work in the LUST Program be discontinued. Upon your concurrence, investigation and remediation of these sites will be performed under Operable Unit 16 in the Installation Restoration (IR) Program.
