

Tom,

The Interim Measures Report (IMR) for SWMUs #14/00 and #17/04 will be submitted to the Navy this week for review. Even though the actual field work associated with the interim measures for these SWMUs was completed last fall, the supporting analytical data was not received until much later. The last of the raw analytical data was received from American Environmental Network (AEN) on 3/18/96. This data was necessary to complete verification of the analytical results associated with this interim action. Per our previous discussions with your office, we consider the 180 day period for submitting the report to the EPA started on 3/18/96. We are currently obtaining the remaining analytical data for other SWMUs from AEN so that we can close-out that subcontract. Our new lab (CompuChem) appears to be more responsive, so we do not expect the same lag for completing the IMRs for the other SWMUs.
