This is a follow-up to the Technical Review Committee meeting held on February 9, 1993. One of the items on the agenda dealt with Proposed Site Grouping, Interim Actions and a Revised Interagency Agreement (IAG) Schedule.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency agrees with the approach that any sites that are in close proximity should be grouped together for future study and with the Interim Actions proposed at Sites 19, 20, 22, 24 & 25.

You mentioned that a Proposal for Site Grouping and a Plan for the Interim Actions would be sent to me within 30 days, that is by March 9, 1993. Once the Proposal for Site Grouping has been reviewed and agreed upon, the IAG schedule will have to be revised.
