

MINUTES FOR TRC MEETING
OF AUGUST 8, 1994
NAVAL WEAPONS STATION (NWS) EARLE
COLTS NECK, NEW JERSEY

1. The meeting was opened at 10:00 AM by Mr. John Koliccius, the Remedial Project Manager for NWS EARLE. Minutes of the April 21, 1994 were discussed. No unresolved action remained.

2. Mr. Koliccius stated reasons to develop accurate site maps ie. data validity, impacts to adjacent areas and reproducible data. A site visit was conducted for members of EPA'S Biological Technical Assistance Group (BTAG) on July 18 1994. The BTAG members recommended revising site maps to be correct so that accurate field sampling locations can be developed.

3. Captain John Shick expressed his concern about the lack of progress at NWS Earle sites. He suggested developing a POA&M for each site to monitor progress. Mr. Greg Goepfert of NWS Earle has begun to develop this list (copy enclosed).

*** Mr Greg Goepfert will complete the list by November 16, 1994.**

4. Mr. Koliccius stated the need to get letter off the EPA for close out of 14 Epic sites and Site 8. Agreement to provide this letter was documented in a previous TRC meeting.

*** Mr. Paul Ingrisano agreed to write the letter before leaving Earle, in October 1994, as Project Manager for the EPA.**

5. Captain Shick asked what action or documents are required to remove a site from the list. Mr. Ingrisano (EPA) stated that a Site close-out letter concurring with the PA is required for Site removal. Also, Mr. Paul Ingrisano stated a ROD is not required to remove the EPIC Sites because they are in the Preliminary Assessment stage.

6. LCDR Scott Smith asked what direction is Site 20 heading, and is mapping an issue for this site. Mr Bob Lewandowski (NORTHDIIV) explained that the draft Action Memorandum was complete and the EECA would be complete next week. Also, no additional mapping is required to complete the blasting grit Removal Action.

*** (NORTHDIIV) will complete the Action Memorandum and EECA and update site map if it is beneficial. ECD September 30, 1994**

7. Ms. Teri Sudnik (Monmouth County Health Department) offered to provide access to Monmouth County's GIS system for mapping the sites.
