This letter is in response to your June 17, 1992 submittal. The submittal included certifications signed by J.P. Dell, Lieutenant Commander, CEC, U.S. Navy Public Works Officer, W.M. Migrala, Jr., Commanding Officer and Albert G. Gray New Jersey Professional Engineer, license number GE34291 in accordance with N.J.A.C. 7:26-9.8(1) for the closure of the two thousand (2,000) gallon waste oil storage tank located West of building C-14. The certifications document completion of the closure of the tank in accordance with the March 24, 1987 subsequently amended December 5, 1990 approved closure plan.

Based on a review of the files and a closure certification inspection performed on July 10, 1992 by William J. Kaiser of the Central Bureau of Water and Hazardous Waste Enforcement Field Operations and John P. Scott of the Bureau of Hazardous Waste Engineering (BHWE) the BHWE has determined that Naval Weapons Station Earle (NWSE) has complied with the procedures of the March 24, 1987 subsequently amended December 10, 1990 closure plan approval for the closure of the two thousand (2,000) gallon waste oil storage tank located West of building C-14. Therefore, the BHWE accepts NWSE's June 17, 1992 closure certifications. However, this area still remains subject to the Federal Facility Agreement Under CERCLA Section 120, NWSE entered with the USEPA on December 10, 1990.
