Dear Mr. Scholley:

The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has reviewed the referenced Open Burning permit application. On the basis of the information provided, the Department concludes that the application satisfies all applicable requirements of the New Jersey Air Pollution Control regulations codified at N.J.A.C. 7:27 et seq. This Open Burning Permit shall supersede any existing Open Burning Permits issued for the specified site. This permit allows for inspection and evaluation of the Open Burning by the Department to assure conformance with all provisions of N.J.A.C. 7:27 et seq. and any other applicable federal requirements codified at 40 CFR 52, 60, 61 and 63.

The Department hereby issues this permit and certificate under the authority of chapter 106, P.L. 1967(N.J.S.A 26:2C-9.2). Issuance of this permit does not relieve Naval Weapons Station Earle from obtaining and complying with all other applicable permits, local ordinances, permissions, licenses, regulations and statues.

As a condition of approval, the permittee is required to contact the Department's 24-Hour Communication Center at 1-877-WARN DEP (1-877-927-6337) 24 hours prior to any open burning event. The following information must be supplied: name of responsible person who is conducting the open burning (permittee); the actual location of the open burning; the telephone number of the responsible contact; the description of material to be burned. The New Jersey Bureau of Forest Management must also be contacted 24-hours prior to an open burning event during periods of high forest fire possibility. See the attached list for the correct contact in the Division of Forest Fire Management. Failure to comply will be a violation of N.J.A.C. 7:27-2.4(a).

As a condition of approval you must make every effort to reduce and eventually eliminate the quantity and frequency of dangerous materials to be burned. Renewal of this permit for a period beyond its present date will be contingent upon your efforts and accomplishments to reduce the need to open burn dangerous material.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.A.C. 7:27-1.32, you are entitled to an Adjudicatory Hearing if in your judgment as an applicant for an air pollution permit, the Department is imposing any unreasonable condition of approval. Pursuant to the Administrative Code N.J.A.C.1:1 you may request a contested case hearing. Any request for a contested case hearing must be received in writing, by the Department within twenty (20) calendar days of the date you receive this permit approval. It must contain the information specified in the permit action appeal form which can be obtained from our web site, [www.state.nj.us/dep/aqpp](http://www.state.nj.us/dep/aqpp).
