Dear Mr. Cabiness:

On February 14, 1995, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) staff attended a meeting at the Naval Industrial Reserve Ordnance Plant facility as requested by the U.S. Navy to discuss plans to investigate soil under the floor of the East Plating Room in the main building on the facility. Please find enclosed a copy of a memorandum from Mark Ferrey to me dated February 17, 1995. This memorandum is provided to you as a record of the MPCA staff understanding concerning specifics about the above-cited investigation. Please review this memorandum and identify any specifics that you do not agree with.

Although the MPCA staff has not concluded that the U.S. Navy will find significant soil contamination under the floor of the building in this area, the MPCA staff cannot agree at this time that a removal action or a remedial action will not be required in this area as a result of the investigation. The Navy should understand that if a removal action or a remedial action is needed as a result of this or a later investigation that the MPCA staff is not waiving its rights to require the U.S. Navy to conduct such a removal or remedial action in this area.


