

## PUBLIC NOTICE Record of Decision Five-Year Review Joint Expeditionary Base Little Creek Virginia Beach, Virginia

The Department of the Navy and the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region III, are beginning the second Five-Year Review of existing Record of Decision (ROD) documents and ongoing remedial (environmental cleanup) actions at Joint Expeditionary Base (JEB) Little Creek, located in Virginia Beach, Virginia. A ROD is a public document explaining the selected remedial action for implementation at a site. In accordance with the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act, as amended, and the National Contingency Plan [40 Code of Federal Regulations Part 300.430(f)(4)(iii)], remedial actions which result in any hazardous substances, pollutants, or contaminants remaining at the site above levels that allow for unlimited use and unrestricted exposure must be reviewed every five years. The Five-Year Review period for JEB Little Creek began when the Navy signed the first ROD for the Base. The purpose of the Five-Year Review is to ensure these environmental cleanup actions continue to adequately protect human health and the environment. The Navy will submit draft findings of the Five-Year Review to EPA and the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality in September 2013. The final Five-Year Review report will be made available to the public in March 2014.

### RODs and remedial actions to be reviewed:

**Site 7 - Amphibious Base Landfill:** A soil cover was placed on the landfill following completion of landfilling activities. The soil cover was enhanced under a Decision Document signed in January 1998. A ROD was signed in September 2009 selecting maintenance of the existing soil cover, land use controls, and long-term monitoring of groundwater as the remedy for the site. Remedy implementation was completed in Fiscal Year (FY) 2012.

**Sites 9 and 10 - Driving Range Landfill and Sewage Treatment Plant Landfill:** A soil cover was placed on the landfills following completion of landfilling activities. The ROD was signed in December 2003 selecting land use controls and long-term monitoring of groundwater as the remedy for each site. Remedy implementation was completed in FY 2005.

**Site 11 - Former School of Music Pinning Shop:** The ROD was signed in July 2007 selecting enhanced reductive dechlorination (ERD) of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in groundwater, land use controls, and groundwater monitoring as the remedy for the site. Remedy implementation was completed in FY 2012. Land use controls are in place to prohibit the use of groundwater.

**Site 11a - Building 3033 Former Waste Oil Tank:** The ROD was signed in September 2011 selecting ERD of VOCs in groundwater, land use controls, and groundwater monitoring as the remedy for the site. Remedy implementation is ongoing and is expected to be completed in FY 2013. Land use controls will be put in place to prohibit the use of groundwater.

**Site 12 - Former Exchange Laundry:** The ROD was signed in September 2005 and an Explanation of Significant Differences was signed in October 2006 selecting ERD of VOCs in groundwater, land use controls, and groundwater monitoring as the remedy for the site. Remedy implementation was completed in FY 2010. Land use controls are in place to prohibit the use of groundwater.

**Site 13 - Former Public Works Center Dip Tank and Wash Rack:** The ROD was signed in September 2007 selecting ERD of VOCs and pentachlorophenol in groundwater, land use controls, and groundwater monitoring as the remedy for the site. Remedy implementation was completed in FY 2012. Land use controls are in place to prohibit the use of groundwater.

The remedy for each site was selected based on findings contained in documents that are part of the Administrative Record for JEB Little Creek, which can be accessed at the following location:
