

Fraud alleged
Victoria L. Dubay, 30, of 886 Broadway, Apt. 1, Newport, was arrested Tuesday on a charge of fraudulently using credit cards. Jamestown police contacted Middletown police in April and reported that a woman working for a Middletown home health-care business had been using a 79-year-old Jamestown woman's debit card without permission. The woman claimed Dubay had made 17 transactions in Middletown totaling \$6,500. Police said they spoke to Dubay, who insisted she had permission to use the card. Police obtained a warrant to review ATM transactions related to the incident and later obtained an arrest warrant for Dubay. Newport police arrested her at her home Tuesday about 8:20 p.m. and turned her over to Middletown police. There also was a Superior Court warrant charging Dubay with failing to show up for a pretrial conference, police said.

SUPERIOR COURT

NEWPORT - Superior Court Judge William C. Clifton considered the following case Tuesday:

◆ Gardner M. Devos, 37, of 66 Girard Ave. pleaded no contest to a charge of possessing heroin with the intent to deliver the drug. The judge imposed an eight-year prison sentence, but he suspended five years of the term and ordered Devos to serve the remaining three years in the Adult Correctional Institutions in Cranston. He will be on probation for five years after his release.

In Superior Court on Monday:

◆ Barry W. Zurybida, 57, of 43 Squantum Drive, Middletown, pleaded no contest to a charge of having sexual conduct with a girl younger than 15 in 2005. The judge imposed a 20-year prison sentence, but he suspended 13 years of the term and ordered Zurybida to serve the remaining seven years in the ACL. The term will run concurrently with a federal sentence he is serving. Zurybida was ordered to have no contact with the victim, to register as a sex offender and to seek counseling. He will be on probation for 13 years after his release from prison.

◆ Pedro Jimenez, 37, of Bristol pleaded no contest to charges of possessing cocaine with the intent to deliver the drug and driving after his license had been suspended. He was fined \$250 and ordered to serve 20 months of a 10-year prison sentence. Jimenez will be on probation for eight years and four months after his release from the ACI.

A second charge of possessing cocaine was dismissed.

2 duck hunters dead after boat capsizes

WESTPORT, Mass. (AP) - Two duck hunters died and a third was rushed to a hospital Tuesday after they fell into the frigid waters of the Westport River when their boat capsized.

Bristol District Attorney Sam Sutter's office said Steven James, 53, of Marshfield and Robert Becher, 55, of Cromwell, Conn., died.

The surviving hunter was identified as Gregg Angell, 51, of Westport. He was taken to Rhode Island Hospital in Providence, and is expected to survive.

The hunters' skiff was found overturned at about 9 a.m. Tuesday, Westport Harbormaster Richard Earle said.

"It was cold, there was freezing spray, they had what appeared to be an aluminum boat about 16 feet long," Earle said. "It was pretty choppy and icy."

Coast Guard Petty Officer Robert Simpson said the water temperature was about 35 degrees and the air temperature was about 8 degrees at the time. Simpson said two of the hunters were found in the water, about half a mile from the overturned boat. The surviving hunter was rescued by a Coast Guard helicopter and had symptoms of hypothermia, Simpson said.
