James graduated in 1954. Upon graduation he enlisted in the Air Force from 1954 until 1958.


After doing his tour of duty, he graduated from the University of Massachusetts and was employed for the Department of Corrections as a senior probation officer in Newport County.

DISTRICT COURT

NEWPORT — Judge Colleen Hastings considered the following cases Thursday in District Court:

◆ Harrison Alfred Patuto, 21, of 364 Bellevue Ave., Apt. B1, pleaded no contest to driving while intoxicated. He was ordered to pay a \$100 fine and \$680.50 in fees and assessments, to complete 10 hours of community service and to surrender his license for 30 days.

◆ Hillary A. Joyce, 49, of 603 West Main Road, Little Compton, pleaded no contest to reckless driving, which was amended

from driving under the influence as part of a court-approved plea bargaining agreement. She was placed on probation for a year and ordered to complete substance abuse treatment.

Coyne was recharged with felony domestic assault, after prosecutors reviewed her arrest history and realized this was her third domestic arrest. SUPERIOR COURT

NEWPORT — Jacob Mumme, 23, of 781 Bristol Ferry Road, Portsmouth, pleaded no contest Thursday in Superior Court to domestic simple assault, domestic refusal to relinquish a telephone, domestic disorderly conduct and domestic trespassing, which was amended from domestic breaking and entering as part of a court-approved plea bargaining agreement.

Judge Stephen P. Nugent placed Mumme on probation for 3½ years and ordered him to complete a batterers' intervention program and pay \$860 in court fees and assessments.

A no-contact order between Mumme and a 25-year-old local woman will be in place until Jan. 7, 2020.

According to Newport police reports included in court files, on Dec. 16, 2015, police responded to an apartment on Catherine Street after receiving a call from a friend of the woman who lived there. When police arrived, the woman told them Mumme had kicked through the deadbolt on her door, and then pushed her and slapped her in the face. Police said the woman had injuries consistent with an assault. Mumme was arrested outside the apartment.

Domestic breaking and entering

Roberto Tito Moura, 47, of 178 Park Holm was arrested at a Chapel Street apartment Thursday about 1:10 a.m. on charges of domestic breaking and entering — a felony — and violating a no-contact order.

Police said Moura was arrested on Chapel Street near Edgar Court. Police said a background check revealed the no-contact order.

Moura appeared in District Court on Thursday morning and did not enter pleas to the charges against him. Pleas are not typically entered for felony offenses first heard at the District Court level. He was ordered held without bail at the Adult Correctional Institutions because the arrest violated the terms of his probation for a no contest plea in August 2015 to a Newport police charge of domestic trespassing. A violation hearing was scheduled for July 12.

Assault, obstruction charges

Marlon Lopez Hernandez, 21, of Norton, N.J., was arrested outside the Star Bar Bistro, 212 Thames St., Thursday about 12:05 a.m. on charges of simple assault, obstruction and a District Court warrant for failing to appear at arraignment for driving with a suspended license.

Police said a 25-year-old local man told them that Hernandez had punched him in the face outside the bar, when they stepped out to smoke marijuana. Police said Hernandez repeatedly gave them false names and date of births while being processed, until background checks using his fingerprints, height, weight and tattoos revealed his identity.

Hernandez appeared in District Court on Thursday morning and pleaded innocent to simple assault and obstruction. Bail was set at \$5,000 with surety, or \$500 cash. Hernandez did not post bail and was transported to the Adult

Correctional Institutions. A pretrial hearing was scheduled for Wednesday, July 13.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
REQUEST FOR SOUND VARIANCE OF THE
MIDDLETOWN NOISE ORDINANCE

Pursuant to Sections 130.75 – 130.91 of the Middletown Town Code, entitled "Noise", notice is hereby given that the Middletown Town Council will conduct a Public Hearing to hear the petition of The Narragansett Electric Company, d/b/a National Grid, for a sound variance to the Noise Ordinance for its Aquidneck Island Reliability Project.

BACKGROUND:

The Narragansett Electric Company ("TNEC") has filed a Petition seeking a variance from the Middletown Noise Ordinance for construction related noise that may be generated outside of permitted hours during the construction of the Aquidneck Island Reliability Project ("AIRP") in Middletown. AIRP is a set of projects aimed at improving the reliability of the electric system on Aquidneck Island. The portion of the AIRP that is the subject of this application includes the construction of a new Jepson Substation, which will be built on the west side of Jepson Lane in Middletown on land owned by TNEC, the realignment of the 63 69 kV transmission line ("63 Line"), and the extension of the 61 and 62 kV transmission lines ("61 and 62 Lines"). The new Jepson Lane Substation will replace the existing Jepson Substation, which is located across the street at 500 Jepson Lane in Portsmouth. The realignment of the 63 Line and the extension of the 61 and 62 Lines will connect said lines to the new substation.

SPECIFIC VARIANCE REQUESTED:

TNEC requests a variance from the construction noise hour limitations for the entire construction phase of the Project (approximately 30 months). The specific Noise Ordinance provision and requested relief are as follows

1. Noise Hours Limitation:

a. **Existing Limits:** Construction and demolition noise is limited to 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. pursuant to Noise Ordinance § 130.78(H).

b. **Requested Variance:** Allow occasional extended hours of construction noise when associated with (i) tasks that must be completed once started, including, for instance, concrete pours and transformer installation, and (ii) extended work hours in preparation for wire pulling and related activities.

This hearing will be held at the Middletown Town Hall, Town Council Chambers, located at 350 East Main Road, Middletown, Rhode Island 02842 on July 18, 2016 at 7:00 PM.

All interested persons are invited to attend and be heard. Middletown Town hall is handicapped accessible; individuals requiring interpreter services for the hearing-impaired should notify the Town Clerk's Office at 847-0009 not less than 48 hours before this meeting.
