

## Obituaries



### Edward B. Mack

**MESA, Ariz.** — Edward Beach Mack, 89, of Mesa, AR passed away on Friday, September 2, 2016. Born in Watertown, CT on June 10, 1927, son of the late Harold P. and Ruth Beach Mack Johnson. His father was a machinist at the Naval Torpedo Station in Newport during World War II, and Ed read meters for the Newport gas company while attending Rogers High School. At Rogers he also met his wife-to-be, Jean Marilyn Baker, daughter of Mabel Adams Baker and Lavannah A. Baker, who was also a machinist at the Torpedo Station and later at General Electric. After graduating from Rogers in 1944, he joined the U.S. Army Air Force where he served with the 8th Weather Wing in Labrador.

After the war, Ed married Jean Baker in Newport and resettled in New Haven, CT. He attended Southern Connecticut State University and went on to teach art in the Wilton, CT public schools for 33 years. His studies and training took him to Yale University, Columbia University, University of Chicago (as a John Hay Fellow), Williams College, and the University of Bridgeport. In the 1950s he and Jean moved to Wilton, CT and later, Weston, CT. He expanded his activities beyond teaching and school administration to community affairs, including the Wilton Playshop, public library, senior center, Silvermine Guild of Artists, various churches, youth groups and other local organizations. He also created and exhibited his own artworks in a variety of media and styles.

After retiring to Mesa, Ariz., in 1994, he volunteered his time and skills for the Heard Museum Guild, the Arizona Museum of Natural History, the Mesa Arts Center, and two international organizations that sent him to Honduras and Guatemala as a design consultant to indigenous woodcarvers. He continued the archaeological work he had begun in Connecticut by volunteering with projects affiliated with the Arizona Natural History Museum. He and his wife also actively supported the Mesa Arts Center and the Sonoran Desert Chorale for more than 20 years.


He was predeceased by his wife, Jean Baker Mack, in 2009.

Survivors include daughters Jan Northcutt, Lyn Mack (Larry Welty) and Wendy Mack Allred (Jeffrey) of Mesa; a sister, Audrey Mack Hall (Harold) of Phoenix; a niece and several cousins.

### Cocaine charge

Joseph R. Smith, 35, of 15 Meeting St. was arrested on Broadway near Mann Avenue on Tuesday about 3:30 p.m. on a charge of distributing crack cocaine.

Police said officers from the Narcotics Unit were monitoring Broadway and stopped him after they saw him engaged in what appeared to be suspicious activity. They searched Smith and found a bag containing 17 individual bags of crack cocaine, police said.

Smith entered no plea to the charge at his arraignment in District Court on Wednesday. The charge is a felony that must be referred to the state attorney general's office.

He was ordered held without bail at the Adult Correctional Institutions in Cranston. A status hearing was scheduled for Sept. 20.

### False report charged

Two girls were arrested in three separate incidents at a group home on Bristol Ferry Road Tuesday.

A 14-year-old girl was arrested about 2:25 p.m. on a vandalism charge. A 26-year-old female employee reported the girl climbed on top of a shed and kicked out a storm window.

Another 14-year-old girl was arrested at 6:50 p.m. on assault, disorderly conduct and vandalism charges. A 26-year-old male employee reported she tried to rip off a banister in the front of the home and kicked in a front window. When he attempted to take a rock out of her hand, the man said the girl punched him in the face.

Police said they were called back to the group home at 7:45 p.m. The same 14-year-old girl had locked herself in a bathroom, police said, and had a piece of glass. The girl tried to stab a 22-year-old female staffer

with the glass, police said, and was cutting herself when officers arrived.

Patrol Officer Allison M. O'Connor and Lt. George Grassi had to use restraint techniques on the girl until she dropped the piece of glass, police said. She then became upset and tried to attack a staff member, police said.

The girl was restrained again and taken to Newport Hospital for an evaluation, police said. After two hours the girl was allowed to return to the home, police said. She was charged with assault with a dangerous weapon and disorderly conduct.

### Driver arrested
