1. Page 2.4, Section 2.4.1 (Area B Removal Action): This section states that confirmation soil sampling and analysis, as outlined in Remedial Action Close-out Report verified that the soil clean-up levels were met. Please note that we have forwarded you our comments on "Soils and Debris Removal, Camp Allen Landfill, Area B" document and awaiting your response.
2. Tables 5.2, 5.3 and 5.4: The qualifiers (J,K,L etc) used in the tables are not explained. Please provide a footnote explaining these qualifiers.
3. Table 9.2: Clean-up goals for Water Table aquifer were set based on incidental ingestion and non-potable use while more stringent goals were set for Yorktown aquifer based on MCL's. Since confining layer between Water Table and Yorktown aquifer is missing at several places (page 2-3 PRAP), remigration of contaminants from Water Table aquifer to Yorktown aquifer would take place.
4. Page 9.8: Although migration of contaminants from Yorktown aquifer in area A2 is not expected to occur off the Navy property, it is likely that contaminants may get migrated in to Yorktown aquifer in area A1.
