Subject: CASY-TO 060 - Suspected UXO uncovered

Good afternoon everyone,

I would like to inform everyone of our most recent findings at CASY. This afternoon during XRF sampling activities we uncovered a suspected UXO (cannonball). It is a solid metallic ball approx. 7 inches diameter with an approx. 1 inch diameter hole (packed with dirt) on one side only. This object was found about 50 feet west of the area-2 original excavation west wall in grid G-27 (XRF sample grid #267) at only 1-2 inches below grade. Personnel were immediately cleared from the area and this area was taped off limits until further investigation.

Also today, we uncovered 4 unidentified gas cylinders during our XRF sampling activities. One of the four has several large holes in it and is most likely not a concern. Another looks severely damaged and is probably not an issue. However, I could not see any clear damage other than normal deterioration for two of the four cylinders. These cylinders were all uncovered at 0-2 feet below grade about 80 ft. SW of the original hotspot-20 excavation limits in grid G-27 (XRF sampling grid 421). One of the cylinders was uncovered at only about 2 inches below grade. Again, all personnel were cleared from this area and it was taped off limits until further investigation.

I spoke with Zane Perry (ROICC) this afternoon about our findings and we agreed that the area containing the suspect UXO will remain taped off limits until next week. Zane will arrange to have a Navy EOD specialist visit the site next week. The air cylinder area will also remain taped off limits and OHM will pursue ID and disposal matters next week.
