Good morning everyone. Please see attached revised RTC. These most recent RTC now account for SCDHEC's 20 October comments on the RTC version resulting after last Friday's call. I realize that Meredith is out, however I am obligated to attempt to attain an approved SAP prior to mobilization so I am sending this out with full knowledge that Meredith is unavailable. Meredith has asked me to copy Stacey and Susan while she is out, and I am optimistic that either (or both) can acknowledge if we've now addressed the Department's remaining comments, and maybe approve the SAP (even conditionally). I do not believe that we disagree with any of Meredith's 20 October comments, and have attempted to integrate these into the RTC. I will attempt to contact DHEC later today to determine what is possible.

These most recent modifications have resulted in some minor tweaks to language provided by directly by EPA, but I don't believe the alterations impact the intent of EPA's statements (at least regarding EPA's intentions or concerns).

Hopefully, everyone can read the source of the responses by placing the computer mouse over the new text. On my machine, green text remains from some of Greg's work on the previous revision. Red text is my current changes. The red text is interspersed with blue, which represents as much of Meredith's original comment as I could integrate into the response. Text deletions are shown in the right margin.

Please let us know if the changes made in the attached RTC revision would now result in both EPA and SCDHEC SAP approval. We sincerely appreciate that I think both agencies now support the 26 October mobilization. Thanks. MS. 412-921-8216.
