The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is responding to your letter to Michael J. McGagh June 14, 1994 expressing an intent to file an application for a Technical Assistance Grant (TAG) at Portsmouth Naval Shipyard in Kittery, Maine.

As required by Federal regulations, EPA will publish public notices in local newspapers serving communities affected by the site, announcing that the Seacoast Anti-Pollution League intends to file a formal grant application at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard in Kittery, Maine. In addition, EPA will be mailing letters to all individuals on the site mailing list informing them of your intent to file for the available Technical Assistance Grant (TAG) for that site. A copy of this public notice will be sent to you upon publication. You will have 30 days from the date of the public notice to form a coalition with other interested groups to file a single grant application. If agreement cannot be reached, all interested applicants will have an additional 30 days to file separate applications. EPA will then review all applications and choose a single recipient.

If EPA does not receive other letters of intent within 30 days of publication of the public notices, you will be notified and asked to file a formal grant application. Please note that your State does require intergovernmental review of all grant applications under this program.
