WHEREAS, Site 30 is an in-ground area beneath the floor of Building 184 at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard that previously held tanks that were used as part of an industrial cleaning operation conducted in the building; and

WHEREAS, the industrial cleaning operation involved the use of hazardous materials; and

WHEREAS, the industrial cleaning operation was discontinued in the 1960's and the tanks were removed and the area filled in; and


WHEREAS, recent investigations of the area in accordance with the Shipyard's Installation Restoration Program show that it represents a potential risk to human health and environment; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the U.S. Navy that the site be excavated and the excavated materials properly disposed of off-site as outlined in the December 2002 Engineering Evaluation/Cost Analysis for Site 30, Alternative 3,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Kittery Town Council, by unanimous consent, given the facts presented, concurs with the U.S. Navy's recommendation for Site 30, providing follow-up monitoring is done, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Kittery Town Council believes this solution mitigates future risk to human health and the environment at this site.
