SOUTH BERWICK, Maine — Daniel Densch, cherished husband, beloved friend to many and talented film editor, passed away Thursday, Nov. 15, 2012, at home in South Berwick, Maine, in the arms of his loving wife, Arilda. It had been 14 months since a diagnosis of stage four esophageal cancer, which he had fought bravely through pain with good cheer. He was 47 years old.

Dan is survived by his wife of 17 years, Arilda Elskus Densch; Carl and Mary Densch of Sarasota, Fla.; half-sisters Jennifer, Jessica and Laura, and their husbands and children; Helga Densch of Berlin, Germany; his birth mother and her husband, Beverly and Steve Kuzman of Sarasota; and Dan's birth father and his wife, Bill and Harriet Kopolas of Mesa, Ariz.
