MALNOURISHED HORSES RESCUED BY N.H. SPCA

Group seeks donations to house animals

STRATHAM — The New Hampshire Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals said it rescued four horses last week in Derry because the owners could not afford to provide them nutrition, veterinary care or farrier services. One of them, a 5-year-old paint pony, had given birth, prompting a call from the animal control officer when the mother was too emaciated to feed her newborn colt, the SPCA said.

Steve Sprowl, investigator and field services manager for the SPCA, took the call Oct. 23 and used the SPCA's horse trailer to pick up the mother and baby. The colt was rushed to New England Equine Medical Center in Dover. Staff there worked through the night to save the newborn colt, but it died the next day, the SPCA said. The mother was brought to the SPCA's barn in Stratham to be fed and comforted. On Friday, Oct. 25, the SPCA

staff said it returned to the Derry home to pick up an additional three equines that were in varying degrees of malnutrition and muscle waste. All four horses are being evaluated by an equine veterinarian. The three rescued were an 11-year-old gelding, who is underweight with clear signs of muscle waste, a 2-year-old mini-stallion and a 15-year-old Roan gelding.

All of the horses were voluntarily surrendered, the SPCA said, because the owners realized they were past the point of being able to care for them. The horses are now the property of the agency, which must take on all expenses associated with their care. The SPCA said it is hopeful the horses will be adoptable after a period of rehabilitation.

The SPCA seeks financial contributions to its SOS Fund to help pay for the veterinary care and rehabilitation, which may span many months. The ROD documents the selected remedy for OU7 under the federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA). The Selected Remedy for OU7 includes excavation of contaminated subsurface soil from two areas in the southeastern portion of the site to remove contamination based on potential industrial worker risks, implementation of land use controls (LUCs) via a LUC Remedial Design to prevent future potential residential exposure to contaminated material and future potential erosion of contaminated material to the offshore area, and five-year reviews to ensure the remedy remains protective of human health and the environment.
