## White House reviews subpoena for tech chief

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. — The White House is reviewing a subpoena for testimony from its top technology chief, but a spokesman called the request from a House panel an “unnecessary” distraction from the administration’s work to fix the broken health insurance website.

Rick Weiss, a spokesman for the Office of Science and Technology Policy, said officials will “respond as appropriate” to the subpoena issued Friday by Rep. Darrell Issa, R-Calif., chairman of the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee. Issa is investigating why the federal website, three years in the making, was not ready for launch Oct. 1.

“This is an unfortunate and unnecessary step since we made clear several times that Todd Park is willing to testify,” Weiss said. “We had hoped the committee would work with us to find an alternative date to give Todd time to focus on the immediate task at hand: getting the website fixed.”

In a letter sent with the summons Friday, Issa noted that Park, the U.S. chief technology officer, was first asked to brief the committee on the troubles with HealthCare.gov on Oct. 21. The White House responded Oct. 30 that Park was too busy fixing the flawed website, Issa said.

Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sebelius and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services Administrator Marilyn Tavenner have both testified twice before House and Senate committees on problems related to the launch of the online insurance marketplace.

BERLIN — Michael Ickes lights candles Saturday in commemoration on the 75th anniversary of Kristallnacht, or Night of Glass. Similar events were held to remember the night of Nov. 9, 1938, when Nazi groups across Germany and Austria burned down more than 1,000 synagogues and smashed windows in Jewish-owned businesses.

## 7 killed in gun battles with Boko Haram sect

KANO, Nigeria — Five members of the Nigerian Islamist sect Boko Haram and two soldiers were killed in gun battles in Kano on Saturday, the army said, the first violence in months linked to insurgents in the largest northern city.

A military task force stormed two buildings suspected of being Boko Haram safe houses in the Hotooro Dan Marke and Brigade areas of the city around 3 a.m., when the battles occurred, an army statement said.

## Undercover N.Y. officer indicted in SUV attack

NEW YORK — An undercover New York police detective and 10 other motorcycle riders have been indicted in an attack in September on an SUV driver that was featured on YouTube, local media reported.

All but one of the riders were charged with gang assault in an indictment announced by the Manhattan district attorney’s office Friday, The New York Times reported. Other charges included first- and second-degree assault and riot.

## At least 60 killed as Syrian rebels retake base

BEIRUT — Islamist rebels retook most of a military base in northern Syria from forces loyal to President Bashar Assad on Saturday after two days of fighting in which at least 60 people have been killed, a monitoring group said.

The heavy fighting reflects the strategic importance of the base, a few hundred yards from Aleppo airport on the eastern approaches of the city. Rebels had held the site for nine months until Friday, when Assad’s troops, pushed them out.

## Hawaii House passes bill to legalize gay marriage

After a 12-hour session, the Hawaii House of Representatives late Friday passed a bill to legalize same-sex marriage. The vote came just days after Illinois lawmakers approved a gay marriage bill.

When the vote was tallied at the Capitol in Honolulu, hundreds cheered and waved rainbow flags.

The state Senate, which passed a similar bill last month, will likely take up the measure Tuesday.

## Utah doctor found guilty in 2007 bath drowning

A Utah doctor was found guilty Saturday of murdering his wife by drugging her with painkillers and sleeping pills and drowning her in a bathtub, local media reported.

The verdict against Martin MacNeill, 57, came more than six years after Michele MacNeill was found unconscious in the bathtub in the couple’s home south of Salt Lake City.

The verdict came about 1 a.m., after the jury had deliberated for 11 hours, according to the Deseret News.

## Olympic torch travels to space station for walk

MOSCOW — The Russian relay in the approach to the Sochi Olympic Games reached its peak Saturday, figuratively and literally, as two Russian cosmonauts took the Olympic torch on a walk outside the International Space Station about 200 miles above Earth.

The torch, tied to the station by two ropes for security, was passed between the cosmonauts for an hour as they changed positions in search of a better vantage point for a photo op.

## Maldives voters poised to return to polls again

Voters in the Maldives seemed fated to return to the polls Sunday for a runoff vote after the country’s third attempt since September to pick a president failed to yield an outright winner.

Former President Mohamed Nasheed was in the lead with nearly 47 percent after Saturday’s voting — short of the 50 percent threshold to avoid a runoff — as election officials reported 99 percent of ballots counted. Yaamin Abdul Gayoom was second with 30 percent.
