# Boy, 14, accused of pointing gun at siblings

JAMES CITY — A teenage boy who is accused of stealing his parents' handgun and pointing it at his siblings on Tuesday has been charged with one felony and two misdemeanors.

Maj. Stephen Rubino with James City County Police said the 14-year-old boy took the handgun from his parents' home in the 100 block of Lindrick Drive in Ford's Colony.

He said the 14-year-old then reportedly pointed the firearm at his 13-year-old sister and 9-year-old brother before leaving the residence on foot and heading toward the woods near

his house. Officers located the boy in the woods a short time later and took him into custody, according to Rubino. "He dropped the gun," Rubino said. "We searched for it but were unable to locate it."

He said it's unclear if the firearm was loaded at the time of the incident as it has not been recovered.

The 14-year-old boy has been charged with felony larceny of a firearm and two counts of misdemeanor brandishing of a firearm.
