**Naval Station Mayport Installation Restoration Program
Public Notice of Containment and Monitored Natural Attenuation for
Solid Waste Management Units 14 and 15**

The Navy, with concurrence from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, is proposing final corrective actions for Solid Waste Management Units (SWMU's) 14 and 15 at Naval Station (NAVSTA) Mayport in Mayport, Florida. The proposed corrective measures for soil at both SWMU's include (1) providing a cap over the contaminated surface soil areas that are not currently capped to limit exposure; (2) imposing Land Use Controls (LUCs) in the form of a cap/soil disturbance prohibition; and (3) site monitoring to ensure that the LUCs are in place. The proposed corrective measures for groundwater at both SWMUs include monitored natural attenuation (MNA) and LUCs. The LUCs would prohibit the use of the groundwater for drinking water and control future development of the site until MNA or any future corrective measure allows for unrestricted use.

SWMU 14 has been used for the fire fighting training since approximately 1964. SWMU 14 is located south of the St. Johns River, approximately 1,000 feet of the Atlantic Ocean in the northeastern part of NAVSTA Mayport.

The Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Facility Investigation (RFI) and corrective Measures Study (CMS) for SWMU 14 identified metals, organics, and total petroleum hydrocarbons in soil and groundwater at concentrations in excess of their respective background screening or cleanup target levels.

SWMU 15, the Old Pesticide Handling Area, was used for the storage and mixing of pesticides during 1963 and 1964. SWMU 15 is located in the northwestern part of NAVSTA, Mayport, approximately 350 feet east of the western boundary of the installation and approximately 700 feet west of Runway 23/5.

The RFI and CMS for SWMU 15 identified metals and pesticides in soil and groundwater at concentrations in excess of their respective background screening values or cleanup target levels.

Based on the results of the RFIs and CMSs, and Statements of Basis, the Navy is proposing a containment action for soil as a final remedy and MNA for groundwater for SWMUs 14 and 15.

A copy of the RFI, CMS, and the Statements of Basis along with the rest of the Administrative Record file is available for review at the NAVSTA Mayport Information Repository.
