I have reviewed the subject document. The Contamination Assessment Plan (CAP) for Site 1517 was dated February 2009 and was received on February 20, 2009. This CAP provides the rationale and methodology for performing field activities to characterize soil and groundwater conditions at the site, Building 1517. The objective of the proposed field investigation is to determine the extent of possible adverse soil and/or groundwater impacts associated with the former 2,000-gallon above ground storage tank (AST) associated with the site. I concur with the two phased approach for conducting the contamination assessment at this site that the Navy and their contractor have outlined in this document. I also agree that the investigations will meet the requirements of Chapter 62-770.600, F.A.C., for completion of a site assessment. However, even though soil samples can be compared directly to default criteria, it may be useful to collect extra soil at each sample location so that site specific SPLP data, and possibly TRPH fractionation data, may be gathered and evaluated during this assessment event.
