- 3. Determination of areas and volumes of impacted media exceeding Florida Department of Environmental Protection criteria.*
- 4. Development, screening, and evaluation of corrective action alternatives.*
- 5. Recommendation of corrective actions to address contaminated media related to SWMUs 2, 3, 4, 5, and 22."*

Based on my review of the data presented in the document, the evaluation of technologies, and assessment of various alternatives performed, the Department is in concurrence with each

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SWMUs 2, 3, 4, 5, and 22, Naval Station Mayport
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SWMU's recommended Soil Alternative, and with the Groundwater Alternative that was chosen for the SWMUs.
