I am registered to practice Engineering in the State of Tennessee (Certificate No. 12,915); I was retained by the Naval Air Station Memphis to observe the decontamination of the interim status hazardous waste storage facility near Building S-242 at NAS Memphis.


I have reviewed the Closure Plan for the facility, dated November 14, 1984, and am familiar with the closure procedures specified in that plan.

Based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for the collection of soil samples specified in the Closure Plan, I am satisfied that the samples were collected at the locations and depths specified. I have also reviewed the laboratory results of the analyses of the soil samples, and I concur with the report of General Engineering Laboratories that the results demonstrate that the material is not an EP toxic hazardous waste. The methylene chloride concentrations in the soils in the vicinity of the pad are not significantly different from that in the background sample. Therefore, according to the Closure Plan, no excavation of soil surrounding or beneath the pad was justified.

On March 25, 1985, I observed the decontamination of the storage facility. The Navy personnel performing the decontamination received detailed instructions regarding the procedures comprising each step of decontamination. They received additional instructions relating to the wearing, care and replacement of protective clothing. The decontamination was performed in accordance with the Closure Plan. All debris, wash water, rinse water, used protective clothing and contaminated equipment were containerized; the containers were closed and labeled for transport off-site. Reusable equipment was decontaminated following the procedures specified in the Closure Plan prior to removal from the site.

Based upon my inquiry and review of the soil sampling and analysis and my personal observation of the decontamination activities, I certify that the facility was closed in accordance with the November 14, 1984 Closure Plan.

In reference to the telephone conversation of May 11, 1988, between you and Ms. Diane Lancaster of our Environmental Division, we are notifying you that the Naval Hospital, Millington, Tennessee, qualifies as a conditionally exempt small quantity generator under conditions specified in Tennessee Rule Chapter 1200-1-11-.02(1)(e).

The Naval Hospital, Millington, qualifies as a conditionally exempt small quantity generator because they do not generate more than 100kg of hazardous waste per month or more than 1000kg of hazardous waste per year. This waste can be transported along a public road (Navy Road) to the Hazardous Waste Storage Facility on the north side of Naval Air Station Memphis.
