LCDR Ballinger, the Navy Co-Chair, welcomed the RAB and the community. Ballinger called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m. Approximately ten members of the general public were in attendance. Co-Chair Ballinger also welcomed the members of the Defense Environmental Restoration Task Force (DERTF) who were attending the RAB meeting. Each RAB member then made a brief self-introduction. Sherri Wasserman Goodman, the Undersecretary of Defense for Environmental Security and a DERTF member, was then introduced by Co-Chair Ballinger.

Ms. Goodman remarked that DERTF members were at the RAB meeting to listen and observe. She explained that the task force was formed in September 1993 as a sort of "super RAB." DERTF's mission is to review Installations Restoration activities at Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) sites (i.e., closing sites) like NTC, Orlando, with a focus on reuse and environmental issues. Ms. Goodman stressed that public involvement initiatives such as RABs are an important element of the Department of Defense (DoD) cleanup program nationally.

### RAB Administration

**Membership Items:** Co-Chair Ballinger announced that Gina Edwards submitted her resignation to the RAB.

The RAB next addressed new membership selection. Vice Co-Chair Di Silkwood read the names of the approximately 20 nominees on the ballot. Those nominees in attendance then made a brief statement on their background and interest in serving on the RAB. Ballots were then distributed to the RAB members with instructions to select five nominees. Ballots were anonymously marked by each RAB member, and Capt. Yesensky was asked to tabulate the votes. The results were announced later in the meeting, and the selected nominees were:

**Note:** The first four individuals listed above were selected on the first ballot. A three-way runoff was required to select the fifth new member. That runoff resulted in a two-way tie, and the RAB decided to have both of those individuals (Warner and Henninger) join the RAB.

**New RAB Business:** Navy Co-Chair Ballinger announced that the RAB meeting originally scheduled for March 14 had been rescheduled to March 13 (**Note:** the meeting was subsequently rescheduled for March 20).

### BRAC Update/Upcoming Activities

Mr. Wayne Hansel, BRAC Environmental Coordinator for the Navy, provided an update on ongoing and upcoming fieldwork at NTC, Orlando. His report is summarized in Attachment D to this meeting summary. Highlights of Mr. Hansel's report are presented below:

*Group I Study Areas* - The Site Screening Report has been reviewed by the Navy and the regulators. Seven study areas have been found to require no further action. Study areas 8 and 9 (Greenskeeper Storage and Former Pesticide/Herbicide Storage areas) have been named as Operable Unit (OU) 3 and require interim cleanup (for soil) and further investigation (for water). Additional site screening activities at Study Area 3 (RTC 1st Lt. Storage area) and the pistol ranges have been completed and lab results are pending.

*Main Base New Sites* - Field work on six former U.S. Air Force sites and two sites within Group IV has begun and is expected to be finished in April.

*Area C* - Study Area 11 (Cold Storage Warehouse) has been found to require no further action. Study Areas 12, 13, and 14 (the Base Laundry and associated areas) has been designated as OU 4 (see **Special Topic** below).

*Herndon Annex* - The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will conduct field work in mid- to late February at the old fire training area (currently Greater Orlando Aviation Authority property) to determine the source of the benzene plume.

*McCoy Annex New Sites* - Five of the new Air Force sites are currently being screened with completion expected in April.

*Petroleum Tank Program* - All tanks scheduled for 1995 and 1996 removal have been removed (83 tanks). Assessment reports needed on approximately 50 of those sites. Current assessment data indicate that water contamination will need to be addressed at 15 tank sites, five of which also have soil contamination. The next group of tanks are scheduled for removal in 1997 and 1998. These tanks are at facilities that will remain active until that time.

*Property Transfer* - Two Environmental Baseline Surveys (EBS) for transfer have been completed since the November RAB meeting. These are for Buildings 310 and 311, and for Building 305.

#### Questions from the RAB on the BRAC Update

**Is the Army now taking responsibility for the contamination and any cleanup at the former fire training area at Herndon Annex?** The Army Corps of Engineers has agreed to perform the investigations to determine the source of the benzene plume at the site. Cleanup issues will still require negotiation by the appropriate parties.

**Which area of soil contamination identified at NTC, Orlando is the most widespread?** The largest instance of soil contamination is associated with the McCoy Annex gas station. Navy contractor personnel estimated that an area the size of a soccer field has some degree of soil contamination.

**What is the deepest soil contamination associated with any of the storage tank sites?** To date, the deepest instance of soil contamination at a tank site is four to five feet.

**Where does the money the Navy charges for property leasing go?** Leasing arrangements include a charge that covers maintenance costs on the property only. Thus, the Navy is not "renting" these properties in the conventional sense. RAB member Bruce Hossfield, the RAB representative from the City of Orlando Redevelopment Agency, added that no leases between the Navy and the city had been executed to date. He added that the leasing process for properties at Herndon Annex was furthest along. Mr. Hansel noted that leasing activities have generally taken longer than expected, mainly due to the legal issues associated with the process.

Capt. Yesensky then provided a brief update on discussions with the city regarding early transfer of the NTC golf course and some property in the southwest corner of the Main Base. Yesensky said that the Navy has agreed to accelerate investigations in the southwest corner area and delay work on some less desirable properties. He added that Records of Decision which officially document final actions for a site must be completed before any transfer of southwest corner properties can occur. Capt. Yesensky also noted that the Navy has offered to transfer nine holes of the golf course by January 1998, and turnover the remaining nine holes in December 1998. This would accommodate recreational use by Navy personnel who will be stationed at NTC until that time.

#### **RAB Feedback on November Special Topic:**

Presentations on Current Property Transfer Proposals and OU 2 Site Screening Results: There was no feedback from the RAB on the special topic presentations from the November meeting.

#### **Special Topic: Operable Unit 4 Investigations**

RAB Member John Mitchell of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) presented an overview of the ongoing studies at OU 4, which is the former base laundry and surrounding areas. OU 4 is in Area C of NTC, Orlando. Area C is 2 miles west of the Main Base, adjacent to the Koger Business Center and fronting Lake Druid. Sampling at Lake Druid was performed at the request of the RAB. Highlights of Mr. Mitchell's presentation included:

- Sampling Locations
- Location of the Contamination
- Potential Contaminant Movement
- Type of Contamination Found
- Regulatory Compliance/Potential Health Risks
- Future Actions including Interim Cleanup

Mr. Mitchell summarized the findings of the OU 4 investigations to date. Groundwater, surface water, and soil at the site has been found to contain tetrachlorethene (PCE) and associated breakdown products. PCE is commonly used in dry cleaning operations and was used at the laundry facility. Contaminant levels at some OU 4 sampling locations exceed state environmental standards, but a specialized risk evaluation conducted by FDEP, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and Navy consultants found that present contaminant levels present no threat to human health. This study considered exposures to swimmers in Lake Druid, the most likely method of human contact with the contaminants. Mr. Mitchell noted that samples taken furthest out in Lake Druid showed little or no contamination.

Mr. Mitchell then offered several possibilities on how the contaminants might be moving through the ground. These scenarios considered specific geological characteristics of the site which appear to prevent the contamination from moving downward to the aquifer.

Future actions at the site were then discussed. These include additional investigations on: the source and extent of contamination; groundwater flow; subsurface conditions; site history; surrounding water supply and use; and identification of nearby wetlands. The latter may effect the interim cleanup action for the site. This interim cleanup will follow a focused investigation and will be designed to stop contaminant migration into Lake Druid, and to reduce long-term

costs of the permanent cleanup at the site. FDEP will also close an inactive production well at the base laundry facility. Mr. Mitchell then asked for comments or questions from the RAB regarding his presentation. These are summarized below.

**Could contaminants enter Lake Druid through a discharge point in the lake bed?** This scenario is possible but not considered likely based on the data collected to this point.

**What are some potential cleanup options at OU 4?** Cleanup options include pumping to prevent groundwater flow toward from Lake Druid, onsite groundwater treatment to remove contaminants, or construction of a physical barrier to prevent contaminant movement toward the lake.

**How will the interim cleanup at OU 4 be funded?** The most likely option will be to transfer funds initially set aside for OU 1 activities which are no longer required. This process is known as deobligation. Another option is to request new funding.

**How serious are the human health risks at OU 4?** Based on the results of a risk evaluation conducted under FDEP guidelines, there are no human health risks at OU 4. This finding has been independently verified by the federal Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry and the Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services. Soil ingestion would present a health risk in an uncontrolled setting, but access to OU 4 is restricted. A scenario where residents lived on the OU 4 site for several years would also pose a health risk, but such use would not be allowed under current site conditions.

The RAB business portion of the meeting concluded at 8:25 p.m., and the meeting was adjourned by Navy Co-Chair Ballinger. The floor was then opened up for comments and questions from the general public.

#### Comments/Questions from the Community:

(Note: Questions and answers are paraphrased.)

***Who reviews documents that are required for property transfer to ensure that contaminated properties are not be leased or sold?*** Environmental Baseline Surveys, FOSLs, and FOSTs (Findings of Suitability for Transfer) for property transfers are subject to several levels of Navy review, including: NTC, Orlando; Southern Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command; and DoD scrutiny. The EBS, FOSL, and FOST documents, which form the basis for any property transfer decision, are also reviewed by FDEP and USEPA. The background material developed in preparation of EBSs is routinely presented to the RAB. EBS reports are available for public review at the NTC, Orlando Information Repository at the Orange County Public Library in downtown Orlando.

***Would the Navy conduct environmental investigations at NTC, Orlando if the facility was not scheduled to close?*** Yes. At a minimum, a preliminary environmental assessment called a Hazard Ranking System scoring is required for all military installations in the U.S. The Department of Defense has parallel environmental cleanup programs underway for closing (or

BRAC) bases and for facilities that will remain active.

*Over the last ten years, approximately \$10 billion has been spent on military environmental programs nationwide, and five percent of this amount has gone to actual cleanup. Why has this small proportion gone to cleaning up sites, and is there an accounting available regarding specific expenditures at NTC, Orlando?* The IR program at NTC, Orlando and nationwide is being done in stages, where the execution of each phase is based on findings from the prior one. The first stage was to identify the sites that merit further study. This work accounted for most of the initial costs and has been completed. More than 24,000 sites at over 800 installations have been identified. 60 percent of current IR program funding now goes to actual site cleanup work. DoD is ahead of other federal agencies and private hazardous waste site programs in terms of completed and ongoing cleanups. Regarding IR program spending at NTC, Orlando, DoD publishes an annual report which shows past and current fiscal year funding, and estimated future program costs for each installation. This report is called the *Defense Environmental Program: Annual Report to Congress* and is available from the NTC, Orlando Public Works Office, (407) 646-4735.

## NTC ORLANDO RAB UPDATE 01/24/96

### FIELDWORK

#### Group I ( RTC Area, Main Base)

- Group I Site Screening Report was given to the OPT on Nov. 8 and reviewed in Dec. Six of the 10 Study Areas have been designated as requiring no further action (NFA). Sites 8 and 9 have been made OU3 and require interim remedial action (IRA) for soils followed by a remedial investigation (RI) for water. The additional site screening at Study Area 3 and lead sampling at the pistol ranges has been completed and we are waiting for the lab results.

#### Main Base Landfill, OU1 (RTC Area)

- The Draft RI/FS Report is due March 96. Results are looking good so far.

#### Main Base New Sites

- Field work has begun on 6 Air Force and Group IV site and should be completed by April.
- Two AST sites where the old Hospital Boiler Plant was still need to be assessed.

#### Area C (Group II, Area "C").

- Group II Report was reviewed in Dec. and Study Areas 13, 14 & 15 have been made OU4. This is the subject of the Special Topic tonight.

#### Herndon Annex

- Army Corps will sample to determine if the old fire training area on GOAA property is the source of the benzene plume. The Army Corps will be doing their field work in the middle to end of February.

#### McCoy Annex (Group III, McCoy Annex)

- Analytical data being evaluated.
- The Draft Group III Site Screening Report was completed in Dec. and is being reviewed by the OPT. Review should be completed by March.

#### McCoy Annex (UXO Sites)

- We have the money to do the UXO work at McCoy and the Mayport EOD team is working it into their schedule.

#### McCoy Annex New Sites

- Five of the Air Force sites in the GOAA parcel are being screened. The work should be completed by April.

#### Petroleum Tanks

- Bechtel has removed all of the tanks scheduled to be removed in 1995 and 1996 (83 tanks).
- ABB has assessment reports to complete on about 50 of those tanks.
