
Dear Mr. Hansel:

I have completed the review of the above reference letter dated June 25, 1998 (received June 29, 1998).

Based upon the analytical results, I concur with the IDW disposal plan for Study Areas 30, 32, 35, 36, 37, and 42. However, the IDW at Study Area 52 contains dieldrin levels which exceed the Soil Cleanup Target Level (SCTL) for leachability (.005 mg/kg). As groundwater at the site has dieldrin levels above the states Groundwater Cleanup Target Level (GCTL) for dieldrin, the IDW should not be returned to the ground, but disposed of in accordance with state and federal requirements.
