

## Legal Notice

The U.S. Navy has proposed a remedial action plan for Site 39 at Naval Air Station Pensacola. A remedial action plan for a site is a design, based on the best available option, for the final step in environmental treatment.

**Site 39 Contamination** — including petroleum-based products, railroad ties and construction debris such as brick, concrete, nails, and glass — was discovered at Site 39, near the Oak Grove Campground, in July 1994, 864 tons of soil were removed and replaced with clean fill. Investigations of the site after the removal found no levels of contamination that would pose a risk to human health and the environment. As a result, the Navy determined that a detailed evaluation of other remedial alternatives would not be necessary, and proposed a plan of "no further action" as the best option.

A public comment period has been established from May 12 through June 28, 1995, and the Navy strongly encourages the public to review the plan and provide comments during that time. A complete copy of the proposed plan is available for public review at the information repositories established by NAS Pensacola. These are located at the following public places:
