Dear Facility Owner/Operator:

The Office of Environmental Programs (OEP), Department of Health and Mental Hygiene has responded to requirements of the 1984 Maryland General Assembly which establish a State Superfund Program. The first step in developing this program is to identify and assess sites where hazardous wastes may be present.

In accordance with these requirements, the Office of Environmental Programs will publish an alphabetized Master List of potential hazardous waste sites in the August 31 Maryland Register. The publication will also include the first 32 of these sites to receive preliminary assessments within the next six months. Your facility is named as one of 16 potential sites in Maryland and may receive a preliminary assessment during this first round (see enclosed list). A copy of the Maryland Register notice is enclosed.

All sites on the list will receive preliminary assessments within the next two years. Based on information from the preliminary assessments, those sites that need further evaluation and sampling will receive site investigations. Sites that warrant no further action will be delisted. A final prioritized list will be published in January 1986. Maryland's program is being conducted in conjunction with the federal Superfund Program.

I am looking forward to your full cooperation as we conduct the investigations necessary to identify those sites which will require some cleanup actions. I will keep you informed about results concerning your facility. Should you need additional information, please feel free to contact Mr. John Koontz, who is directing this effort, at 383-5650.
