

Background

The Industrial Waste Processor (IWP) will allow for the decontamination, and safe disposal of minutely contaminated industrial waste and recyclable metals. The IWP will comply with explosive safety requirements, Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) regulations. The MILCON includes a 3,000 square foot facility built as a staging area to sort, inspect, disassemble, and prepare combustibles such as cardboard, wood, rags, and plastics contaminated with minute amounts of propellants, explosives, or pyrotechnics. In addition, the project will modify the existing Solid Waste Recycling facility by providing changes to the Pollution Control System and installation of an overhead bridge crane and material feed system.
